**Directions:** Using a blank sheet of white paper, draw a poster to help the Civil Defense Program help protect the people of the United States in case of Nuclear Warfare. Think of your poster as being a snapshot in history or something people may have seen in a newspaper or on T.V. at that time.

### **Propaganda Poster Requirements:**

- Choose One type of defense:
  - 1) Community Shelter
  - 2) Personal Bomb Shelter
  - 3) School Shelter
- Title (tells the viewer what to do)
- Very Colorful (catches the viewer's eye)
- Memorable Picture (brings out emotion & relates to the title/message & viewer)
- Creative & Unique (do your own work, no tracing)
- Questions (answered correctly on back of poster, using complete sentences, written in paragraph form)

### Questions (answered on back of poster):

- 1. Who is the intended viewer of this poster?
- 2. Where would this poster be found? (school, farming community, city)?
- 3. What does the poster tell the viewer to do in case of a Nuclear Emergency?

### Answer these questions in a paragraph to receive better than a 2.0

- 4. How might a person feel if they saw this poster?
- 5. What does this poster have to do with the Cold War?
- 6. What is the overall message of this poster?

Grading: 2.0 = Poster meets requirements AND questions 1, 2 and 3 have been answered correctly and in complete sentences..

2.5-3.0 = All of the above AND questions 4, 5, and 6 are also answered. Questions are answered in paragraph form.

3.5-4.0 = All of the above AND the poster is done especially well.

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
